• That night God showed Daniel the king's dream. Daniel told the king, "But there is a God in heaven who reveals secrets, and He has made known what will be in the latter days" (Daniel 2:28). "...He that revealeth secrets maketh known to thee what shall come to pass" (Daniel 2:29). The king had dreamed of a great statue with a head of gold, chest and arms of silver, thighs of brass, legs of iron, and feet of mixed iron and clay (Daniel 2:32-43). God showed Daniel that the statue represented Earth's history: Babylon the head of gold, Medo-Persia the chest and arms of silver, Greece the thighs of brass, Rome the legs of iron, and 10 European tribes the feet of iron and clay. *Every one* of these prophecies has come true and can be historically verified.

• "And whereas thou sawest iron mixed with miry clay, they shall mingle themselves... But they shall not cleave one to another, even as iron is not mixed with clay" (Daniel 2:43). Despite the efforts of Napoleon, King Frederick, Louis XIV, Charles V, and others, the tribes and countries of Europe have never been united...to this day...just as God foretold.

• "And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people: but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever" (Daniel 2:44). The rock represents Christ's eternal kingdom. It is evident that the nations of this earth are in God's hands. History is not a kaleidoscope of random events. History is not made by human kings, presidents or dictators. History is in the hands of God.

The "take-home" message for you . . .
